Matthew 5

44 *But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,*
45 *that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on
the evil and the good and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous...*

Deuteronomy 8:1-14

¹ *Be careful to follow every command I am giving you today, so that you may
live and increase and may enter and possess the land the Lord promised on oath to
your ancestors.* ² *Remember how the Lord your God led you all the way in the
wilderness these forty years, to humble and test you in order to know what was in
your heart, whether or not you would keep his commands.* ³ *He humbled you,
