→THE BIG IDEA: all of us stand as equals in the midst of trials & troubles

1. WHERE HAVE WE BEEN? James 1:1-8

- → Key words have marked our journey so far in our exploration of FAITH + WORKS
 - DISPERSED v1
 - CONSIDER v2
 - · JOY v2
 - ENDURANCE v3
 - PERFECT v4
 - · ASK v5
- →God wants us to fully understand and embrace the value and purpose of the trials and troubles we go through

2. WHERE ARE WE TODAY? James 1:9-11

- →2 paradoxes: seemingly contradictory statements:
 - A. The poor are to boast in their riches
 - -What is his temptation during trials?
 - -What is his "high position" or exaltation? cf James 2:5; 1 Pet 1:3-7; Eph 1:1-12
 - B. The rich are to boast in their poverty
 - -What is his temptation during trials?
 - -What is his "low position" or "humiliation"?
- → Death also is an equalizer cf Job 7:6, 8:9, 14:1-2; Psa 144:4

3. WHERE ARE YOU TODAY?

- → Have you adopted God's point of view regarding trials? If not, why not?
- → Are you boasting about the right things in your life? If not, why not?
- → In which riches are you trusting during trials? Material resources? Or Spiritual ones?
