"Facing Giants". What is a "giant"?

Anything that distracts us from our focus on God. It can be a situation, Circumstance, pain, or a problem that seems too big and overwhelming....

1 Samuel 17: Two key questions

- 1. What do we experience when we face a giant in our life?
- 2. How do we defeat that giant in my life?

1 Samuel 17

His armor bearer walked ahead of him carrying a shield.
